U13 Tournaments

On Wednesday 9th March, the U13 A, B and C teams travelled to Cople for their county tournament. The students were full of excitement to compete and put all their hard work into action on the lacrosse pitch! The C team went undefeated all afternoon and were crowned champions of the 'C' team tournament. The Most Valuable Player was awarded to Zuzanna Wylezek for her outstanding contribution in midfield.

In the 'B' team tournament, BGS secured a place in the final after placing 2nd in their group. They scored a total of 10 goals in the group matches, which was the highest amongst all the teams. After a nail-biting final against Berkhamsted, the team narrowly lost but should be so proud of their achievements and took home a well-deserved silver medal. The Most Valuable Player for the B team was awarded to Hatty Parry.

In the 'A' team tournament, there were seven teams competing to place either 1st or 2nd in their group to qualify them for the final. With wins against St Albans, Haberdashers, Berkhamsted, Haileybury and Abbots Hill, the team were through to the final. They faced 2nd placed Berkhamsted who had only lost one game all day and we knew that the game ahead was going to be a very tough game. BGS found their form and gave it everything they had left, winning 50/50 balls and attacking and defending with sheer determination and drive to win the match 2-1. The Most Valuable Player for the 'A' team was awarded to midfielder Charlotte Proctor but if it were possible all members of the team could have been given this accolade!

U12 Tournaments

We were delighted to see a fantastic turnout for the U12 tournament, which took place on Saturday 12th March 2022.
