

World Hijab Day 2023 reflections

Miss Choudhury (Junior School Teaching Assistant): "Students across BGS demonstrated a real excitement and strong sense of solidarity to participate and promote *World Hijab Day* at BGS. *World Hijab Day* is a great opportunity for students who wear the hijab to feel represented, students and staff who may not be Muslim or wear hijab to reflect on the hijab and wear the hijab, as well as have open discussions about what hijab signifies to individual Muslim women. Events such as this, help heighten students' emotional intelligence as they wear the hijab for a day and experience how it feels, thus enhancing their understanding through first-hand experience. Students were asking thought provoking questions such as 'Why do you wear the hijab?' 'Do you have to wear the hijab?' 'How do you wear it everyday?' There were some students who also stated 'I wore the hijab today to show support to my peer who wears the hijab'. It was an absolutely brilliant day, and great seeing many colourful hijabs around the whole school."

Ms Kelly (Junior School Teacher): "It was so lovely to be a part of *World Hijab Day*! The talk from the sixth formers in the morning gave the girls a really great insight into why Muslim women wear the hijab, addressed any stigma around it and explained why it was

empowering to them. They then gave a great, engaging demonstration showing how to put on a Hijab. It is so important to expose the girls to a range of different cultures, and it was clear to see how much they learnt from it, and how enjoyable it was for them."
