Reflecting on our Summer Senior Concert held on Monday 8th July, I feel immense pride and joy. This evening was more than just performances; it was a celebration of talent, hard work, and our school community's vibrant spirit.

The assembly hall was beautifully transformed with bunting, flowers, and fairy lights, creating a warm and inviting atmosphere.

As the concert began, there was a palpable sense of anticipation. Our Festival-winning choir, Bel Canto, opened the evening with their renditions of *Moon River* and *What a Wonderful World*. After a short interval, the second half began with energetic performances from our Genesis choir. Their renditions of *Opening Up* from *Waitress* and *You Will Be Found* from *Dear Evan Hansen* were highlights of the evening. Grace Berry's solo in *You Will Be Found* was particularly noteworthy, delivered with natural grace and confidence.

Throughout the evening, we enjoyed a range of musical styles and talents. From expressive Musical Theatre solos by Meg Miles and Ellie Thompson to superb instrumental performances by Ella Coupland and Frances Penny, each moment celebrated our students' dedication and artistry. Ellie Rhind's rendition of Haydn's *Trumpet Concerto* connected us to our school's rich musical tradition.

Our symphony orchestra transported the audience with excerpts from *Scheherazade*, culminating in a triumphant rendition of Handel's *Music for the Royal Fireworks* and Florence Price's *Juba Dance*.

The evening concluded with heartfelt performances by our Lower Sixth bands, Astrophe and Counter Act. Their music, dedicated to the memory of our late guitar teacher, Philip Davies, was a touching tribute.

The students' impromptu rendition of *Thank You for the Music* by ABBA as a farewell to me was an emotional and unforgettable moment. It was incredible to realise the impact music had on our students, instilling confidence and providing a sense of belonging. This is my proudest achievement—making music accessible to all and fostering a sense of family.
